#### Structure, Governance and Management

#### **Governing Document**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

#### **Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees**

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

#### **Organisational Structure**

The Kirk Session meets four times a year and is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs within the church.

#### **Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

#### Trustees' Annual Report (cont) Year ended 31 December 2023

#### **Achievements and Performance**

On 1st January 2023 the Parishes of Ardgour, Morvern and Strontian were united into Ardgour, Morvern and Strontian Parish (AMS). On 5th January 2023 in Arainn Shuaineirt, Strontian, there was a Service of Celebration for the linkage of AMS Parish with Ardnamurchan and Acharacle Parish led by Mr McCorkindale, Minister of this linkage.

Through 2023 Mr McCorkindale established a pattern of Services every Sunday in AMS at Ardgour and every alternate fortnight at Strontian and Lochaline. He has been able to sustain this pattern due to very good back-up from Jade Maclean, Probationer, and Ella Gill, Reader. In September Church service times were set at 10 a.m. for Ardgour, and midday on alternate Sundays for Lochaline and Strontian. The Church Services have been supported online by video recordings and live streams of weekly services, online quizzes, and Wednesday evening prayers. Ardgour's current AV system has been upgraded with a large screen over the pulpit. Mr McCorkindale was able in January and July to run Hybrid Services for the Union from Ardgour, which included contributions from Parishes within the Union.

Mr McCorkindale was on sick leave from mid-October after a heart attack but is making a staged return to work from December and hopes to return to full-time work in mid-January 2024. During his period off work, Mrs Gill and Ms MacLean have done a very fine job in keeping the worship pattern going. Online worship, i.e. the Wednesday evening Prayer Sessions, continued. The Session is delighted that Jade McLean is to extend her appointment for up to eighteen months. It is hoped that Ms McLean will be ordained by Clèir Eilean Ì in January 2024.

In June the annual Peninsula picnic and Service at Kingairloch was held for the linkage and was well attended. Ardgour Parish Horticultural Show was held in August, and there was a bumper entry plus a large attendance at this very popular event. Also in August, the Union took a tent at the Strontian Show. This was very successful, with lots of people stopping by to chat.

Communion Services were held on two Sundays in AMS during the year, and October and November saw Harvest Festival services in the churches of the linkage. A Harvest Festival supper was held in Treslaig. Remembrance Sunday was commemorated in Ardgour, Strontian, Lochaline and Drimnin and there was also a Service of Remembrance in Treslaig Hall. Advent saw Christmas Breakfasts in all three communities, with a particularly strong attendance in Ardgour and at Lochaline.

Ardgour's weekly 'Winter Warmer' suppers, funded by 'Inspiring Scotland', carried on into February, with as many as seventy people coming into Ardgour Hall for a two-course evening meal. Mrs. White, Elder, applying on behalf of the Church, achieved a further round of funding for 2024, so these successful community events can continue.

On property matters, the Trustees of the Church of Scotland have designated Strontian Church for closure and wish to put it on the open market. The Strontian Community Company has proposed raising funds to buy the Church to use it as a community hub while permitting services in the building. Discussions are still on-going.

In late summer the exterior paintwork of Ardgour Church was completely refreshed. Keil Church has completed repair work on the Church door. There is work ongoing at the Manse to bring it back up to standard.

#### **Financial Review**

This is the first annual accounts of the new Ardgour, Morvern and Strontian Parish. I took over as Treasurer around April/May time, and we completed the transition from the previous treasurers to myself by June 2023. We closed the three bank accounts at Morvern and two bank accounts at Strontian, transferring their funds to the newly named Ardgour, Morvern and Strontian Parish bank account. We still retain the Ardgour and Kingairloch Fabric Fund bank account.

The principal source of income comes from offerings received at our regular services across five different locations, plus regular donations from congregation members who continue to support our church despite being unable to attend. The Giving to Grow allocation of £8199 has been paid in full. This included a reduction of £1439 to allow for the purchase of additional AV equipment.

The previous years grant of £4480 from Inspiring Scotland to run the Winter Suppers was used, along with the £550 of donations received from the evenings. The excess funding was used for an Advent Supper in November. A new grant of £4140 from National Lottery has been received for the 2024 Winter Suppers. With additional funding from the Ardgour Community Council we have £4318.12 designated to provide winter suppers and a warm space for people to meet and socialise within the Ardgour area.

Overall we have had significant costs this year, with a total of £18,987.30 being spent over our income. The largest expenses were Fabric Repairs & Maintenance, which were in large part due to the EICR work conducted (£4229.40) on Ardgour, Kingairloch and Strontian, as well as the roof repairs and re-painting conducted at Ardgour (£5825.80).

There has been significant repairs made to the Manse, with the costs shared between ourselves and Acharacle & Ardnamurchan. After reclaiming half of one invoice from A&A (£260), the total we spent from the accounts was £4220.06. In addition to this we spent £3048 for resurfacing the driveway, which was paid directly from the Consolidated Fabric Fund (Revenue). In total this year we spent £5647.06 from the Consolidated Fabric Fund (Revenue).

We used the £600 donation that was given by a family in memory of loved ones in 2022 to purchase a range of flower arrangements. We have been donated £200 from a family to plant some trees in memory of loved ones at Kingairloch Church. We still need to send £57 to the Poppy Appeal and £30 to Christian Aid that has been collected over the year. We collected £168 for Life and Work, and are waiting for an additional £42 to cover this years amount. Finally we also are waiting for £1132.66 from Acharacle & Ardnamurchan Parish for the balance of shared costs from the remainder of this year.

It is difficult to ascertain our income in relation to previous years. The transfer of bank accounts to a single account meant that some individuals who were giving by Standing Order did not continue, but that is not the main reason for our over-spend. We only received Gift Aid claims from Ardgour and Morvern this year, which were for 2022. It has been difficult communicating with HMRC, and we are now in a position where we need to set up a new organisation with them to claim gift aid. We still haven't claimed gift aid from Strontian for 2022.

There has been significant work undertaken with our electricity bills at the four buildings. We have moved all of them onto new contracts with EON where we get a better rate. There was also a dispute raised with SSE regarding an overbilling at Strontian of approximately £5000. After taking it to the Energy Ombudsman SSE are going to re-bill the account, which will help us understand what we actually owe. Because of these issues we have not been paying electricity properly at two of our properties since August 2023. Therefore the Heat and Light expense is likely to be under for what it should be this year.

The trajectory of our finances this year is not a positive one. It seems that our income from giving has reduced, our spending has increased, and we have additional costs from both the Giving to Grow contributions and higher energy costs. At this rate it is not sustainable, and requires careful consideration of our next steps.

#### **Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities**

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.
