Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session meets four times a year and is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs within the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Trustees' Annual Report (cont) Vear ended 31 December 2024

Achievements and Performance

The linkage of Ardgour, Morvern and Strontian Parishes (AMS) with Ardnamurchan and Acharacle Parishes is now in its second year and is working well.

Our Minister, Mr McCorkindale, has continued the existing pattern of services in AMS, with a weekly Sunday service in Ardgour at 10 a.m., and midday services alternating between Kiel and Strontian churches. Services were also conducted once a month at Kingairloch and Treslaig. He was supported by Jade MacLean, Probationer, and Ella Gill, Reader.

On the 'peninsulachurches' website, Mr McCorkindale live streams his services fortnightly, with a worship video on the alternate weeks. These have been well received both within the Parish and beyond. Mr McCorkindale has continued his online Wednesday evening prayers on YouTube through the website, and also keeps the Parishes' profile active on Facebook.

Communion Services took place quarterly in the churches, and Mr McCorkindale ran a monthly zoom Communion.

The ordination of Jade MacLean by Clèir Eilean Ì took place in Ardgour in February. The Parishes of the linkage were well represented. Jade's work was hugely appreciated by the Parishes while she was a Probationer; the church was full and the service memorable. The Parishes were delighted for her when in December Jade was called to the Speyside Churches, and our Parishes were well represented at her induction.

An active Christian discussion group has formed at Treslaig, and Mr. McCorkindale conducted well-attended services at Treslaig for Remembrance Sunday and Christmas.

The Abernethy Trust hosted a successful Retreat Day at Kilmalieu in September. A 'Messy Church' was held in Strontian Hall on 14th December, followed by a Carol Service.

The 'Winter Suppers' in Ardgour Village Hall ran for a second year and were extremely well-attended. Funding for these suppers was again organized by Mrs. White, Elder. Each supper was hosted by a different village group. Donations from the suppers went towards a 'Summer Fun Day' at Ardgour Primary school in August. Based at Ardgour Church, an Easter egg hunt was held on the Saturday before Easter.

Kiel Church held a 'Flower Festival' in August. It also staged a successful 'Christmas Tree Festival' in December, involving most of the community.

The new Presbytery of Clèir Eilean Ì held its first on-line meeting in January, with 200 people attending. It subsequently held its first Conference in September in Fort William. Among other business, the Conference approved the Presbytery Mission Plan.

On Property matters, the Manse underwent a much-needed programme of repairs, and Ardgour Church was given an exterior coat of limewash. Strontian Church is in poor repair, and in June the General Trustees agreed to its sale. After much hard work by the Strontian Community Company (Dualchas) the Company was offered £60,000 by the Scottish Land Fund for a Heritage Centre and Worship space at Strontian Church. The purchase of the Church has now gone through.

Financial Review

This is the second annual accounts of the united Ardgour, Morvem and Strontian Parish. It is based on the funds available within our two bank accounts (Current Account and Fabric Account), alongside funds held centrally with the Church of Scotland. The principal source of income comes from offerings received at our regular services across five different locations, plus regular donations from congregational members who continue to support the church despite being unable to attend. The Giving to Grow allocation of £11,988 has been paid in full.

We had £4318.12 from the National Lottery and the Ardgour Community Council to run the 2024 Winter Suppers, of which only £4142.83 was spent. The remainder of this (£175.29) alongside donations collected (£683.21) will be used with the new round of funding received (£6100) from the 'Highland Communities Mental Health & Wellbeing Fund for Adults – Small Grants' to deliver the 2025 Winter Suppers.

We had significantly less costs this year, with a total of £3338.95 spent on Fabric Repairs & Maintenance, alongside £3668.35 spent on Manse Repairs & Maintenance. Some of the Manse Repairs cost were reclaimed through shared costs with Acharacle & Ardnamurchan Parish. Our electricity costs were nearly double the amount from last year, with a total of £5315.78. We spent a total of £5025.92 from the Consolidated Fabric Fund (Revenue) which was spread between Manse Repairs, outstanding electricity bill for Strontian, and part of our buildings insurance.

We collected a significantly more for third parties this year, with a total of £1684.81. A substantial amount of this was both an Ordination gift for the Reverend Jade MacLean, as well as a leaving gift when she left in the December. We sent the outstanding amounts collected last year to the Poppy Appeal and Christian Aid along with the collections from this year. The £200 donation previously designated for the planting of trees at Kingairloch has at the donor's request been used for the purchase of 'God Welcomes All' hymn books for Kingairloch. We received the payments for Life & Work from last year, but are now waiting for a cheque of £171.50 that will show in the 2025 accounts.

Our donation income has increased slightly from last year to a total of £24,013.19 (an increase of £3,206.60). This is primarily from a slight increase in Gift Aid giving (up by £1,250.74) and Open Plate offerings (up by £1,647.54). We are now registered for Gift Aid with HMRC, and have received our Gift Aid reclaim for 2023 (£3,125.39) and will claim 2024 in the new year.

Overall this year was better financially, with increasing our total finances by £1,665.97 at the year end. Though if we look just at our Unrestricted funds, we were only £185.43 higher than last year. Whilst our finances have stabilised this year, this is primarily down to a slight increase in giving and a significant decrease in spending. Careful consideration should be given to future work required at the church buildings, and attempt to increase giving or income where possible.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Ardgour, Morvern and Strontian Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2024 which are set out on pages 8 to 13.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

An examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
